

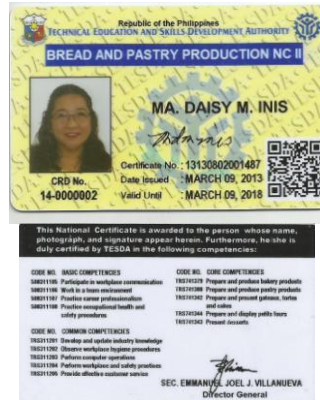
Multi-modal Provision

- **Qualifications carry portable credits**

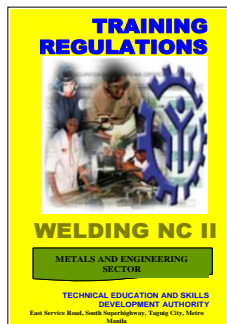
The NC-Plastic Card



Shall **NOT** replace the paper-based NC/COC issued to all successful candidates. The card shall be issued together with the regular paper-based certificates.

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Training Regulations/Competency Standards Development



- Developed by industry experts and practitioners and promulgated by the TESDA Board
- Benchmarked against industry and international standards.
- Contain the national qualification, competency standards, training standards, and assessment and certification arrangements

BOOKKEEPING NC III**

SECTION 1 BOOKKEEPING NC III QUALIFICATION

The BOOKKEEPING NC III Qualification consists of competencies that a person must achieve to enable him/her to journalize transactions, post transactions, prepare trial balance, prepare financial reports and review internal control system.

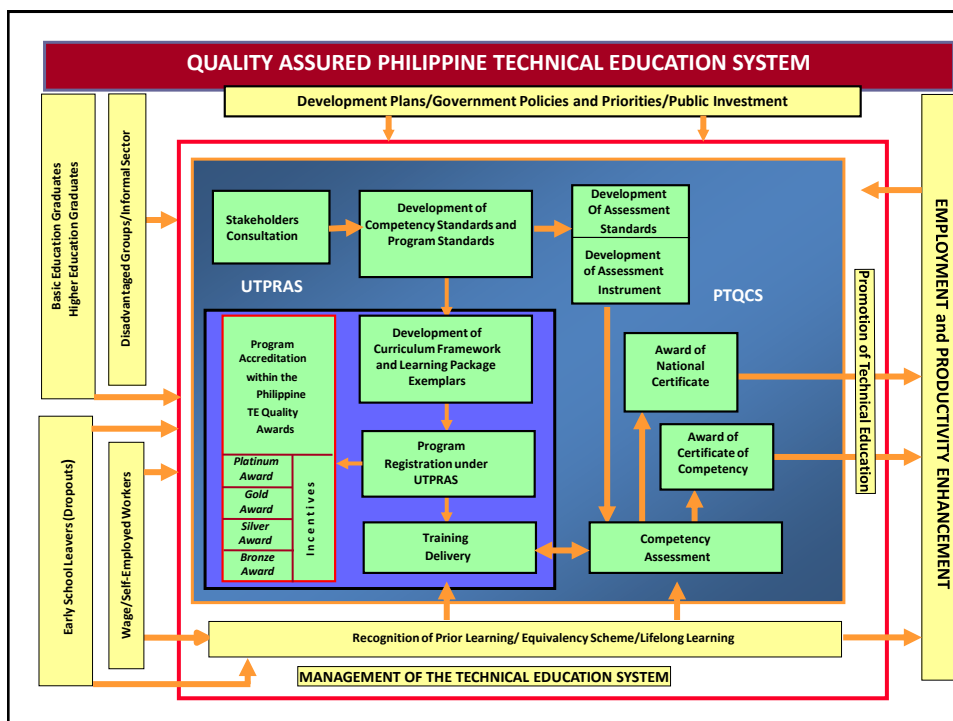
- Recognition of TVET qualifications at both national and regional levels.

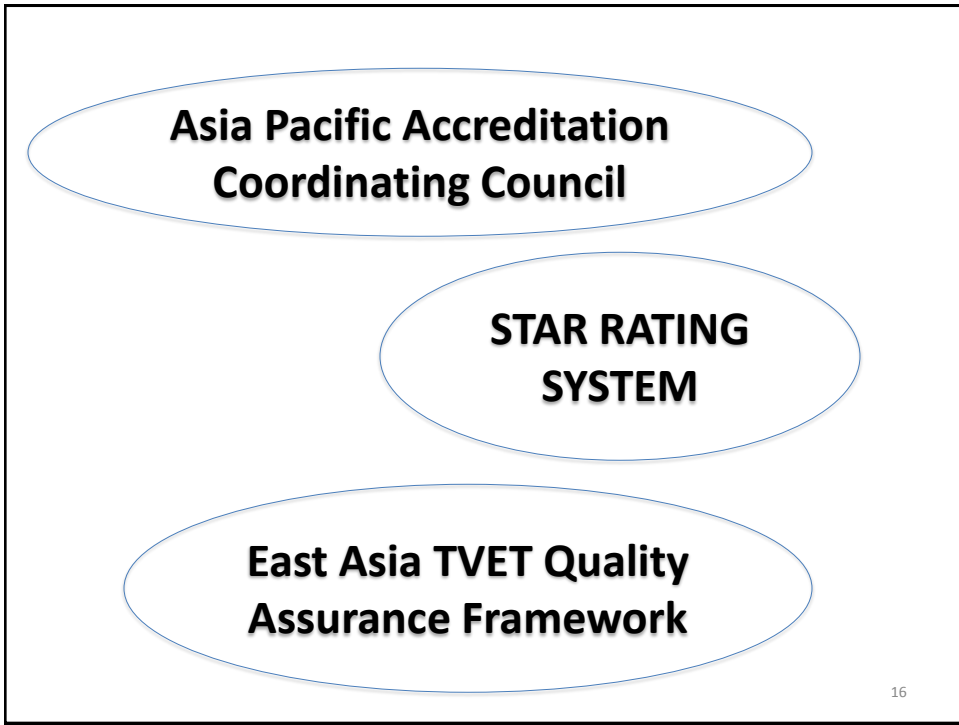
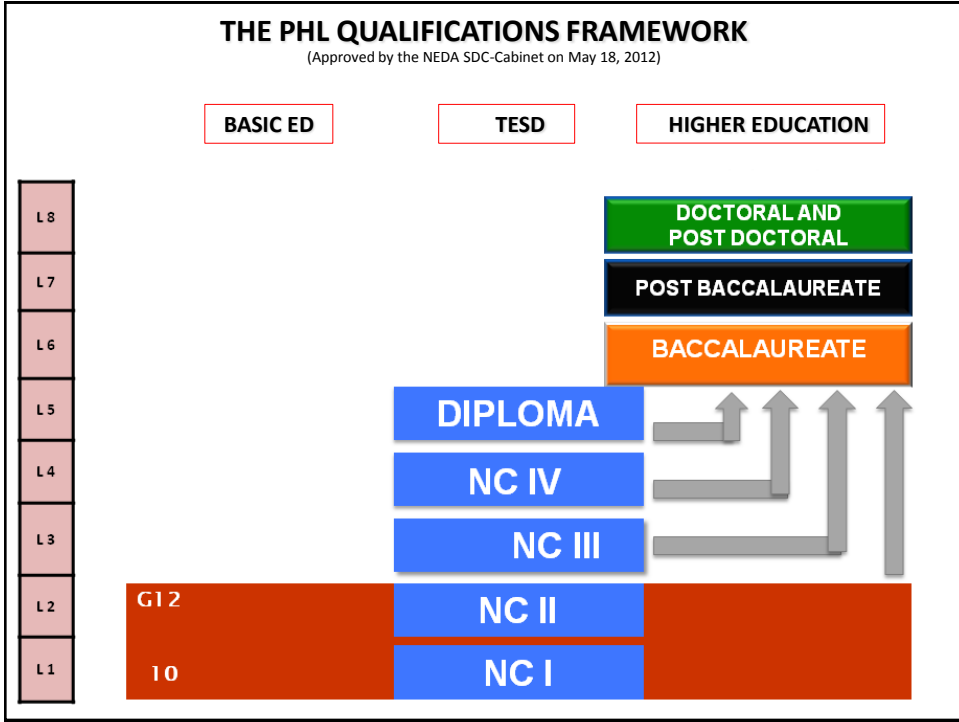
- Regional level recognition to be aligned to the ASEAN Qualifications Reference Framework (AQRF) and its criteria for referencing.
