Southeast Asian DAAD Alumni's Common Cause: Promoting Southeast Asia

Since its establishment in 1925, DAAD has provided funding to more than 1.9 million scholars both in Germany and overseas. The provision has been not only limited to grants and scholarship but also other activities including German Higher Education Institutes internationalization, German studies and language promotion, as well as facilitation to developing countries' higher education development and policy advisory on culture, education, and development issues.

Until 2013, there have been more than 8,000 DAAD scholars originally from Asia-Pacific with 4,000 German scholars who have Asia-Pacific as their destination.



Regional Collaboration and Networks

Along with DAAD's Motto, "Change by Exchange" and its mandate, DAAD in collaboration with the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) will organize a "SEAMEO-DAAD Lecture Series" to optimize the expertise of DAAD alumni in the interest of contributing to education development in the Southeast Asia region.

The SEAMEO-DAAD Lecture Series aims at strengthening the network of DAAD alumni located in the Southeast Asian countries, and promoting their social responsibility by providing an opportunity for them to voluntarily contribute their knowledge and expertise through an on-line platform for upgrading/enhancing knowledge of students and teachers at Technical & Vocational Institutes and Higher Education Institutions.

8. The participants (students and teachers) will receive the Certificate of Participation under the conditions of full participation in the lecture (to be discussed further)
