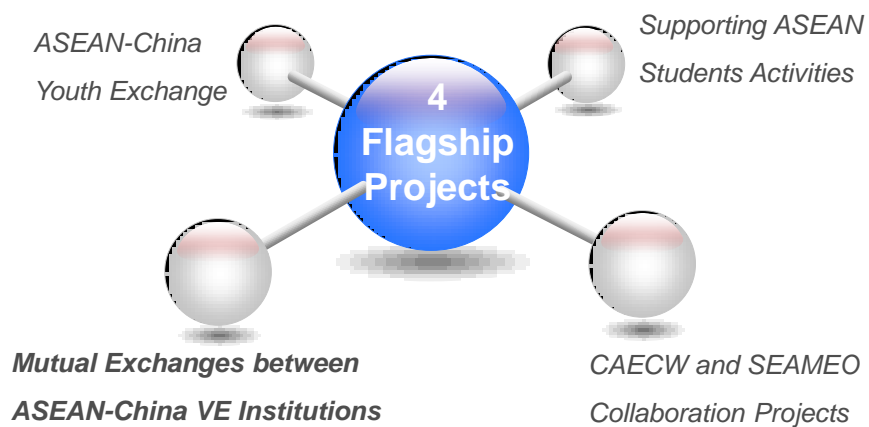

o Outcomes

- Over 300 MOUs were signed between ASEAN and Chinese TVET institutions
- Student Mobility increased
- Teachers' Training strengthened
- Industry Collaboration facilitated (tourism, trade, high-speed railway, etc)
- Mechanism established: ASEAN-China Consortium for Cooperation in TVET
